METHODOLOGY


Online survey	Survey was conducted among a representative sample of Canadians from Research Now panel.
Sample Size	Canada-wide: 4,173 (Comparable Margin of Error + 1.6%)
	Manitoba: 500 (Comparable Margin of Error + 4.5%)
Field dates	February 10 th and 18 th , 2017
Statistical Weighting	Data weighted by age, gender, education and region.



KEY FINDINGS

- Overall, Manitobans have similar views on pharmacists as the national average. 96% of Manitobans have a positive impression of pharmacists (just above the national average).
- A majority (63%) feel that pharmacists play an essential role in the health care system (well above the national average 57%). Manitobans are more likely to view licensed practical nurses as essential to the healthcare system than the national average (64% vs. 56%) and are also more likely view paramedics as essential to the healthcare system than the national average (85% vs. 75%).
- On average Manitobans have a higher level of trust in pharmacists to deliver certain health services as the rest of the country, with the exception of advising on healthy lifestyle changes where they are below the national average. However, they generally have a lower level of trust in paramedics to deliver the same services compared to the national average.
- Awareness of the services pharmacists can provide is slightly lower than other parts of the country.
- Manitobans are more likely than other Canadians to say they are likely to visit a pharmacist to get a vaccine or advice on medicines.
- Manitobans were almost exactly on par to agree that allowing pharmacists to do more for patients will improve health outcomes (82%) and reduce costs in the system (84%) with the national average.


IMPRESSION OF PROFESSIONS



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
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
TRUST - PHARMACIST





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

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

GOING TO YOUR PHARMACIST






If you required the following services, how likely are you to go to a pharmacist to get them?

KEY FINDINGS


- A wide majority (83%) of Manitobans agree that when a healthcare service is covered by Manitoba Health, the Manitoba Government should pay all healthcare professionals who can legally deliver that service to patients. This view holds if a pharmacist service such as assessing and prescribing medication, developing an annual care plan, conducting a medication review, providing smoking cessation or diabetes counseling is covered by public medicare plans in other provinces, it should also be covered in Manitoba (79%) and all healthcare professionals who provide the same healthcare service should receive the same fee (72%)
- Just shy of two-thirds of respondents (62%) said they would likely visit a pharmacist for a lab test.
- Manitobans were mostly aware of the services provided to them by pharmacists with the exception of managing a chronic condition by adjusting your medication where only 44% had either received the service (6%) or was aware but never received it (38%)

PHARMACIST STATEMENTS

When a healthcare service is covered by Manitoba Health, the Manitoba Government should pay all healthcare professionals who can legally deliver that service to patients.










VISIT PHARMACIST FOR A LAB TEST




