All of you, our members, our province's most accessible healthcare professionals, have administered 400,000+ COVID-19 vaccinations and 177,000+ flu shots. That is over 45% of all COVID-19 and flu vaccinations administered to Manitobans. One year ago, we officially launched the Quit Smoking With Your Manitoba Pharmacist Program. A social impact bond partnership with the Government of Manitoba, with support from Canada Life and ClaimSecure.

With 200+ pharmacies across our province participating so far, this is another way you as pharmacists have shown your expertise and talent - by helping combat tobacco use which remains as the leading preventable cause of death and disability in Canada, with over 48,000 Canadians dying annually from a tobacco-related disease. With vour participation we are helping Manitobans – and our healthcare system – breathe easier. Canada's Tobacco Strategy has set a target of less than 5% of Canadians using tobacco by 2035.


Let's continue the momentum and help our province move towards this target. We need your help, especially over the next six months to ensure we hit our initial assessment outcomes. For those of you who have hit the ground running and have been scheduling follow up appointments with patients, we know from primary figures that your efforts are paying off. If you have not already expressed your interest in participating, it's not too late – sign up today! Together, let's ensure this program is successful and stays as a funded service within Manitoba pharmacies.

Not only will your participation in initiatives such as the social impact bond be vital to our community's wellbeing, but it will help us continue to make the case for the need of additional scope of practice advances, as well as the modernization of pharmacy practice in our province, and fair remuneration for these services when we continue our advocacy to government as your sole negotiator on these issues. Your work may speak for itself, but how do we leverage your success, hard work and abilities into advancing the pharmacy profession? MEMBERSHIP & PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE REPORT



Liability insurance is by far the most popular benefit of Pharmacists Manitoba membership as the Annual Insurance Report demonstrates year over year. In 2022, 95% of all members purchased liability insurance at the time of purchasing their membership.

Annual trends have continued in 2022 with an overall increase in the number and percentage of Premium Insurance Policies which provide coverage of \$5Million per occurrence and aggregate. In 2022 we saw an increase in membership numbers which directly correlates with the increase in the number of Basic Insurance Policies that provide coverage at the \$2Million per occurrence/\$4Million aggregate.

MEMBERSHIP & PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE REPORT

The number of Supplementary Policies that are available to pharmacists who already hold a minimum of \$2M valid primary liability insurance coverage through their employer and want to ensure there are no potential gaps in the coverage they receive held steady in 2022 and we are happy to be able to provide this type of coverage to our members who already have coverage through their employer.

Pharmacists Manitoba Professional Liability (Errors & Omissions) Insurance is provided by the Canadian Pharmacists Benefits Association (CPBA) and protects pharmacists against liability or allegations of liability for injury or damages that have resulted from a negligent act, error, omission, or malpractice that has arisen out of professional pharmacist practice.

DID YOU KNOW?

The CPBA policy offered to all Pharmacists Manitoba members also responds if a complaint is made against you to your regulatory body (College) and includes Disciplinary Defence Costs is changing for the upcoming year - it will be \$50,000 per claim/\$50,000 per policy period. (This will not take affect until July 2023)

This benefit is unique to the CPBA insurance program offered to all Pharmacists Manitoba members and ensures the most comprehensive level of insurance for our members!



2022 YEAR IN REVIEW

Ready to Launch (Spring 2022)

After a lengthy delay necessitated by pharmacists' efforts to address the COVID-19 pandemic, *Quit Smoking With Your Manitoba Pharmacist* was officially launched by the Government of Manitoba at Pembina Drugs on April 1, 2022. Along with Minister of Health Audrey Gordon and Minister of Mental Health and Community Wellness Sarah Guillemard, representatives of Pharmacists Manitoba, Shoppers Drug Mart, and Canada Life were hosted by pharmacist and owner Mohammed Ali at his south Winnipeg location for the event.

Pharmacists Manitoba is appreciative of all of your efforts to get *Quit Smoking With Your Manitoba Pharmacist* off the ground and to help Manitobans lead healthier, smoke-free lives. Throughout the remainder of 2022, a lot has occurred with respect to this program, so let's take a few minutes to recap the year.

Leading up to the April 1 launch, several events were held to prepare participating pharmacists to deliver this exciting new service and to build awareness in the community. We hosted live question and answer sessions for participating pharmacists on March 7 and March 29 and a information session for external stakeholders such other health as professionals on March 30. All events were well-attended with great engagement. Additionally, Pharmacists Manitoba launched a public-facing webpage quitsmokingmb.ca that features information on the program, a frequently asked questions page, and a list of all participating pharmacies.

Quit Smoking With Your Manitoba Pharmacist, funded by an innovative finance tool called a social impact bond, received tremendous interest from the pharmacy community, with approximately 200 pharmacies from across the province completing an Expression of Interest prior to the program launch. Over the first three months of the program, more than 200 Manitobans started their journey towards better health.

QUIT SMOKING WITH YOUR MANITOBA PHARMACIST CARRYING THE MOMENTUM

Summer and Fall 2022

It was my privilege on June 22 to co-present, along with a colleague from the province's Health Promotion and Wellness Branch, to the federal/provincial/territorial Tobacco Control Liaison Committee on the social impact bond's origins, objectives, and the early uptake from all of you.

On July 27, I was pleased to co-host a virtual townhall with Pharmacists Manitoba CEO Tanjit Nagra, where we celebrated the first quarter's successes with *Quit Smoking With Your Manitoba Pharmacist*. We heard from those in attendance what is working, what could use improvement, and feedback on how we at Pharmacists Manitoba can support you as we work towards our shared objectives. The full recording is available on the Pharmacists Manitoba Professional Education Platform.

We experienced some challenges with data reporting in *Quit Smoking With Your Manitoba Pharmacist*, as some claims submitted for assessments were not captured by Manitoba Health, particularly in the first quarter of the program (April to June). Pharmacists Manitoba appreciates the patience of those pharmacies affected as we worked to investigate and resolve the situation.

Early in the pandemic, to ensure that Manitobans retained access to the benefits of pharmacist prescribing, where clinically appropriate, the College of Pharmacists of Manitoba enacted an exemption to the Practice Direction on Prescribing, allowing pharmacists to conduct a patient assessment via telephone. This exemption also helped to facilitate access to smoking cessation services under the social impact bond for patients living in remote communities or who were too medically compromised to attend the pharmacy in person. In early October 2022, the College of Pharmacists of Manitoba extended this exemption indefinitely, until a virtual care practice direction can be created or the College chooses to repeal the exemption.

On October 2, Pharmacists Manitoba hosted its Fall Virtual Conference and was pleased to offer an engaging presentation from Todd Prochnau, an Alberta-based consulting pharmacist who designs and presents continuing education primarily in the area of tobacco use disorder. Todd discussed emerging trends in harm reduction related to commercial tobacco.





Resources and Support

Since the launch of *Quit Smoking With Your Manitoba Pharmacist*, Pharmacists Manitoba has worked to provide you with tools and resources to support you in making this program a success.

Templates of letters to send to other health providers and external stakeholders, fillable PDF versions of the assessment forms (if you are completing an appointment without a computer handy – just make sure to input the data at ditchthedarts.ca afterwards!), and a detailed claims submission kit are available on our online learning platform.

A best practices workshop from Amy Oliver & Co. to help you implement a professional smoking cessation program in your pharmacy is also available at no additional cost to members.

Numerous posters, logos, and social media templates are hosted on the Pharmacists Manitoba website for your use, and the public website for the program now features a list of pharmacies providing services in various languages, helping to serve the diverse population that makes up Manitoba.

Toward the end of 2022, Pharmacists Manitoba launched a new promotional campaign for Quit Smoking With Your Manitoba Pharmacist to take advantage of the motivation many people have when starting a new year. Featuring advertisements in print, radio, and social media, the campaign helped to build awareness of the social impact bond and drive traffic our public-facing website. quitsmokingmb.ca As we move into February 2023 and beyond, Pharmacists Manitoba is pleased to celebrate the milestone of over 600 Manitobans being enrolled into Quit Smoking With Your Manitoba Pharmacist. We are beginning to see quit rate data roll in also and early signs are very encouraging.

To those pharmacists that are already providing services under the social impact bond, thank you. Your early adoption and continued efforts are making this program a success. Please continue your engagement throughout the duration of the three-year program.

For those pharmacists who have not yet started offering the service, now is the time. We need all hands on deck to reach our objectives of enrolling 4,500 Manitobans and achieving successful quit rates of 12% at 6- and 12-months and 6% at 24-months. Together, we are paving the way for further expansion in the role of pharmacists in our healthcare system and, indeed, for a healthier Manitoba.





THE PAST YEAR HAS PROVIDED AN OPPORTUNITY TO EXPAND OUR EFFORTS TO INCREASE THE MEMBER VALUE PROPOSITION THROUGH THE INTRODUCTION OF NEW MEMBER BENEFITS. THIS WORK, WHICH BEGAN IN 2021 AND CONTINUED ON IN 2022 HAS RESULTED IN A SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF NEW OFFERINGS AND WE HOPE ALL MEMBERS ARE ACCESSING AS MANY OF THEIR BENEFITS AS POSSIBLE.

In December of 2021 the medSask Member Benefit was introduced and member uptake in 2022 was excellent. medSask is a non-profit organization that supports appropriate prescribing and medication safety by providing accurate, evidence-based medSask also supports pharmacist prescribing of minor ailments through their Minor Ailment and Self-Care Guidelines. Due to medSask's popularity with our members, the benefit has been renewed for another year and will be available to all members through December of 2023. Access to medSask is free for all Pharmacists Manitoba members and all members are encouraged to visit our website to access to this important member resource.

In January of 2022, Pharmacists Manitoba introduced The Canadian Pharmacists Association's CPS Full Access at a 40% discount for a limited time. CPS provides pharmacists with reliable, comprehensive drug and therapeutic information, thousands of drug monographs, current and evidence-based therapeutic information and therapeutic choices for common conditions. We hope our members took advantage of this limited time offer before it ended on April 29, 2022.





Leading into membership renewals in May, the new RxFiles member benefit was introduced. RxFiles is one of Canada's leading academic detailing subscription services, providing drug information for the past 25 years. The Saskatchewan-based service is built to help answer your drug therapy questions through objective comparisons. RxFiles' renowned Drug Comparison Charts are now in their 13th edition and remain one of the leading resources for timely, accurate, and practical drug information for frontline practitioners. Spanning over 240 pages, the Drug Comparison Charts are an essential aid for any practising pharmacist. In addition to the Drug Comparison Charts, Pharmacists Manitoba members also received discounted access to a number of other resources, including Geri-RxFiles for Assessing Medications in Older Adults, Type 2 Diabetes: Strategies, Drug Therapy & Tools, Chronic Pain: Strategies, Drug Therapy & Tools, various Q&A documents, newsletters, trial summaries, and more.

Member access to purchase RxFiles at an 85% discount was open for 7 weeks and 42% of members signed up for the member benefit while it was available which was amazing! We are glad so many members took advantage of this time limited offer.

In May, we introduced new member benefits to support our members achieve their fitness and health goals. This started with the launch of Wellness 365, an outlet where Pharmacists Manitoba members can better their health. Wellness 365 is designed to teach and provide options on eating sustainably and to support your lifestyle. Available with both online training and in-person training, the program is available to our members regardless of where in the province they live. 
